This Easy Read privacy notice will explain what information we collect from you, why we collect it and how we will keep it safe.

What personal information we collect.

In this consultation we collect

- IP address
- Age
- Sexuality
- Gender
- Disability
- Religion
- Race or ethnicity
- Email address to be informed about the climate change engagement plan (optional)

Why we collect and use this information



IP addresses that identify computers

- The IP addresses are collected to make sure only one response per resident is received.
- Once this is checked the IP address information is deleted.



- If you want us to let you about the climate change engagement plan, we will ask you to give your email address.
- This will only be used to send you information about this consultation.



 It will be kept securely on the Council's system and not shared with anyone outside the Council.

Equalities Questions



These are collected to show what groups of people are responding to the questionnaire.

This also lets us know if we need to use different ways to contact groups of people who are not responding.

How long we keep your information



The IP address will be deleted immediately after the checks are done.



We will keep the email addresses for up to two years if you have said you want more information about the Climate Change Engagement Plan.

The equalities information will be kept until the information has been looked at and a report written.



How we use the information and who we share the information with

The information collected in this questionnaire will only be used as numbers in the report.

No information is collected that tells us who you are.



Storing the information

All information is kept safe. Sefton Council follows the laws around data protection.



The laws

We need to make sure we

- Only ask the questions we need to in the questionnaire.
- Ask equalities questions. The law says we must ask and act on this information.

It helps us to know what groups of people are responding to the questionnaire.

It also helps us to know we are not missing groups of people.

You can refuse to answer any questions in the questionnaire.



This is a document that tells you what some of the big words mean that are mentioned in the Climate Change consultation.



Built environment and infrastructure

The place where people live and work.





Carbon (also known as CO2, carbon dioxide, or Green House Gas) is a gas released when we burn fossil fuels such as oil, gas, and coal. Carbon gasses are the major cause of climate change. Therefore, efforts are focused on reducing it.




Carbon footprint

A carbon footprint is the amount of carbon gas released into the air because of the activities of a particular individual, organisation, or community.

Climate change



Climate change is the warming of the planet because of harmful materials humans are putting into the environment. Burning fossil fuels such as gas, oil and coal are warming our planet, this is changing our climate.



Climate Change is a threat to all life on Earth and scientists have said urgent action is needed.

In July 2019 Sefton Council agreed that there is a climate change emergency. We have a plan showing what Sefton Council is going to do to help climate change stop. The report is in easy read.

Community

This consultation gives you the chance to have a say in how you want to be involved in Sefton's climate change response.

We want to hear from as many people as possible, from every part of our borough.



Whether you live, work, or socialise in Sefton we want to hear from you. We will gather all the feedback we receive from this consultation to produce a Climate Change Community Engagement Plan.





Climate change is not a one-off issue, it is ongoing and will not be solved quickly. So, the Council are thinking about setting up a 'climate change community engagement group'.

This group could allow people who live and work in Sefton to work with the Council on climate change action across the Borough.



Ecological Emergency and Biodiversity

Linking climate change action with work to improve the variety of plant and animal life in Sefton – some of it is important.



Energy and Fuel Poverty

A household is classed as being in energy or fuel poverty when they live in a home that does not keep warm and spend so much of their income on fuel that are the then below the poverty line.



Extreme weather events

In Sefton, scientists think climate change will mean we will see warmer wetter winters, hotter drier summers, and more extreme weather events such as storms and heatwaves.



Food insecurity

Not having enough food or types of food.



Green champion

A Green Champion is a person who is passionate about climate action in their home lives and who encourages climate action almost others in their community.



Impact of climate change

Climate change will impact everyone, but particularly those most vulnerable.



Net zero carbon

Net Zero Carbon means the balance between the amount of carbon produced and the amount removed from the air. We reach net zero when the amount we add is no more than the amount taken away.



Renewable energy

A change to using fossil fuels such as natural gas, coal and oil is to use what is called 'renewable energy'. This is energy that cannot be used up and comes from things like the sun and wind. Some examples of renewable energy sources are solar energy, wind energy, hydropower and geothermal energy.
