Coastal areas include:

- beaches.
- sand dunes and grassed areas.
- woodlands and marshes.
- ponds and lakes.
- promenades.
- car parks.
- play areas.
- buildings like toilets and shelters.



A Public Space Protection Order (PSPO) allows the Council to take official actions under the law.



It is used to tackle behaviour that spoils the quality of life for the local community in an area.
